The "CRAM" consists of reviewing (reading) the questions with only the correct answer highlighted from the technician Q&A license pool.

Upon completion, the exam is immediately administered to the class.

The Cram and Exam will require your attendance until 4:30PM

(Exam only 2:30 to 4:30)

Please consider bringing your own small bag lunch and water for the day

This method has proven itself with over a **90% pass rate *IF the participants have studied the material before.***

In depth pre-study is preferred, but just familiarizing yourself with the questions and answers will greatly benefit your chances for success.

We will be using the A.R.R.L. Tech Q&A 8th Edition for the class read through.

The Book is available at www.arrl.com (\$14.95) and www.amazon.com (\$19.95).

A kindle version is also available.

Again, it is highly recommended that you purchase a book and take the time to read and study the contents. The "Cram" works well at "imprinting" the exam answers, but the more you expose yourself to the structure of the question and answers, the better your chances.

The FCC requires TARA to use your Federal Registration Number with your license application.

To obtain an FRN, go to

Follow the directions to obtain your FRN.

Be sure to have this number in your possession BEFORE attending the session.

THE FCC ONLY ACCEPTS YOUR FRN FOR OBTAINING YOUR LICENSE!

Additionally YOU MUST HAVE A VALID EMAIL ADDRESS

This is the method used to confirm your license with the FCC

The "HAM CRAM" is free.

The ***COST OF THE ACTUAL FCC EXAM IS \$15.***

If time permits, a re-test may be offered but will require an additional \$15.

There is also now a required

FCC registration fee of \$35
